Dear Chancellor Cox:

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges, at its meeting January 6-8, 2016, reviewed the Midterm Report and evidentiary materials submitted by Kauai Community College. College leadership, including the president of the governing board and the college chancellor certified the Report. The purpose of the Commission's review was to determine whether the College continues to meet Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards and Commission policies.

After considering the written material noted above, the Commission finds that the College has sustained the work accomplished since the last comprehensive evaluation and has maintained compliance with Eligibility Requirements and the Standards previously identified in the 2012 comprehensive evaluation team report and linked to College Recommendation 1 through 6 and the University of Hawai'i Community College System Recommendations 1 through 5 including consistent implementation of Standard III.A.1.c. The Midterm Report also included the status of the College's Actionable Improvement Plans from the Self Evaluation Report of 2012.

The Commission expects that the changes and improvements noted in the Midterm Report will continue forward in College policies, procedures, practices and outcomes. This will be verified at the time of the next regularly scheduled visit. Kauai Community College's next comprehensive review will occur in **fall 2018**.

The Commission requires that you give the Midterm Report and this letter appropriate dissemination to your college staff and to those who were signatories of your Midterm Report. This group should include the University of Hawai'i Vice President for Community Colleges, campus leadership, and the Board of Regents. You should also make these documents available to all campus constituencies and the public by placing a copy on the college website.


Please note that in response to public interest in accreditation, the Commission requires institutions to post accreditation information on a page no more than one click from the institution's home page.
